Impact on learning

From the period 2017 to 2019, the results show evidence of the gap narrowing. Overall statistics must be treated with caution due to the very small number within the year group. 2020 results are taken from Spring Assessments as the lockdown period started on 23rd March 2020 and SATs were cancelled. The results must be viewed bearing in mind that the results of the Spring Assessments would inform planning and intervention groups for the following period. Final writing assessments were scheduled for later in the Spring Term.

Quality first teaching	All teaching in the school was judged to be Good, evidenced through observations and monitoring and the Ofsted Inspection (February 2020).
Targeted support for Speech and Language	The majority of pupils achieved their speech & language targets and made good progress
Targeted occupational therapist intervention	Through book looks it has been evidenced that there is a higher standard of presentation across the school. Ofsted inspectors commented on the good standard of presentation throughout the school.
Continuous Professional Development	All of the teaching of writing was judged to be Good by Spring 2020. During the lockdown period some staff have undertaken CPD designed to support the mental health and well-being of children across the school. Resources were posted on Instagram and the school website with regards to well-being so this impact will carry on into the next academic year.
Extra enrichment activities	18% of children in receipt of PPG are accessing Music Lessons. 3 pupils in receipt of PPG had their deposit for residential trips paid for.
Funding for Breakfast and After School Clubs	The attendance of 1 child whose place at Breakfast Club is funded has seen an increase in attendance and punctuality.
Salary contribution for Assistant Headteacher	Attendance monitored by AHT and improvements have been seen. 1 child in Year 4 had attendance of 88% and following meetings between the AHT and the family his attendance had improved to 94% in Spring. Parental engagement has increased with PPG families. 4 additional children came on to the PPG register due to the publicising the eligibility for PPG and the AHT speaking at Parent Welcome Meetings. PPG/SEND reviews were undertaken and teachers were able to report on additional strategies they were using to engage PPG children. The majority of PPG parents attended Parents' Evening consultations.
Salary contribution for Attendance Officer	Autumn and Spring Attendance for PPG students was 95%
Salary contribution for specialist teachers: Music/Art/PE	All children are able to access high quality teaching in Music, Art and PE. In the Ofsted inspection, inspectors identified how more able children supported less able and SEND children in Music. 25% of children in receipt of PPG are on the School Football Team.
External agency referrals e.g. EP,	2 children in receipt of PPG are working with an external behaviour support worker and this work has continued through the lockdown period so the impact will be seen in Autumn 2020.
Additional learning resources	Engagement in Reading has increased and was particularly commented on during the Ofsted Inspection including the financial investment in reading.
Well-being of Pupil Premium Children	Each class has two Well-being champions who lead mindfulness activities with their class.

	AHT attended a course on Circle Solutions which was planned to be rolled out during the second half of the year but due to lockdown will be revisited in the Autumn term.
