Y3 News

What a lovely week of learning. We started our week with European languages day, w the kids and teachers had a fantastic time greeting others in their language or any different language they knew. For English we went straight into writing our portal story, paragraph at a time making sure we have used, adjectives, interesting sentence starters and a wide range of adverbs. Next week we will begin our next English focus of instructional texts. Examining all types of instructional literature and the importance of including instructions in our writing. We all had fun in maths this week, relying on our number bonds to answer questions. We will take this knowledge into next week's learning where will be spotting the pattern then beginning to add 1s across a 10. We will be using terminology such as digits, adding, subtracting and partition during our maths lessons. Science was all about the functions of our muscles, the different functions and names of our various muscles. We will move on to the importance of exercise next week, investigating why we need to implement exercise in our daily lives. Topic lesson will be about using a range of resources to find out about a prehistoric site. During Spanish lesson, Year 3 have learnt the numbers from 1 to 6, this will continue next week by learning numbers to 10. Our RE lesson this week was based around the four noble truths. Next week in RE we are going to carry on our understanding and learn about the eight fold path. Y3 had an amazing week this week!

We have had a lovely week in Y5, where it was lovely to see so many of you at Parents Evening. This week, we have been focusing on the -ough sound in Spellings and this was also included in the homework – so well done to everyone who has been practising at home. We are also continuing to focus on positive praise using house points and all the children have been allocated a new house, where they have been enjoying competing against the other houses. In English this week, we finished our mythical text and have now moved on to looking at Explanation Texts where the outcome will be an explanation text of how to play an Ancient Greek Olympic Game. In Maths, we have been looking at word problems, rounding and estimating and are now going to be moving onto our Multiplication and Division Unit where we will look at factors, multiples, square and cube numbers and how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000. If you would like to do any extra work at home, Bitesize, Primary Resources and Maths Is Fun, are all useful websites, as well as White Rose, which is the scheme of work we use at school. In PE to start the week, we have been looking at Invasion Games, where we have looked at how to dribble in Basketball and improving our footwork. Y4 News

We have had a fantastic week in Y4! In Science, the children have been learning about the role that teeth play in the digestive system and how each type of tooth has a distinct purpose. Continuing our exploration of the Frozen Kingdom, the children learned about the perilous journeys that people took in order to reach the South Pole. Using this knowledge, they used their writing skills to draft diary entries from the perspective of these brave explorers. In our English lessons, the children used their recent study of persuasive language and the different features of leaflets to write their own promoting a trip to The Antarctic. This linked nicely knowledge that they had gained in our Frozen Kingdom Topic.

Next week, the children will be learning about climate change: what is it, why is it happening and what can be done to prevent it? The children will have a chance to voice their opinions and discuss whether or not enough is being done to combat climate change. In Science, the children will be carrying out an exploration of teeth to develop their knowledge of how to work scientifically. As mathematicians, the children will revisit adding in 100s and 1000s and progress to adding two four digit numbers. This builds on our place value focus of the last few weeks.
