Y3: Stone Age

You could use a brown or natural coloured t-shirt, roughly cut up the edges of the sleeves and along the bottom. We would suggest legging style trousers to go with the T-shirt. Use any of the following: faux fur, faux animal print fabric, toy bone or bone necklace. To finish the look off, either wear a wig or back comb the hair to look messy. Remember - Stone Age people didn't have the luxury of having a bathroom so they often looked very dirty! Try using face paint to complete the dirty look!



















Y4: Frozen Kingdom

You will need a hat, scarf and gloves to survive in the freezing conditions! Explorers relied upon a sturdy pair of boots and to complete the look, you may want to think about covering your face, so your nose doesn't get frost bite! If you have been skiing, you could wear your ski outfit or waterproof trousers and a fleece would work well.

<u>Y5: Ancient Greeks</u> Traditionally, Greeks wore tunics, robes and togas. This could be as simple as a white bed sheet with a belt. It is advisable that your child wears a top and trousers/ leggings underneath. Alternatively, you could dress up as a mythical creature, hero/heroine from a Greek myth or become a god/goddess for the day e.g. Athena or Ares. Or how about dressing up as Spartan warrior?





<u>Y6: WWII</u> Due to the theme of our workshop, it is recommended that all children dress up as an evacuee with a small bag, a name tag and a box for their gas mask. However, you could choose to wear a traditional dress from the 1940s era or perhaps you could be a land girl with dungarees and a head tie or a WWII soldier in a military outfit?
