Pharaohs

Let's travel back 5000 years, to the dusty realms of ancient Egypt. Cruise along the Nile, entering a world of mysteries and curses, mummies and kings. Find out about life on the river's fertile banks, discovering Egypt and its fascinating culture. Unravel the secrets of ancient tombs, using historical sources and ancient artefacts. Find out about powerful pharaohs and grandiose gods. Make yourself a nemes and you'll really look the part. Become an apprentice and work for Ramose, the chief embalmer at the Beautiful House. Help him prepare a body for its journey into the afterlife. Now open the doorway to ancient Egypt. Who knows what treasures you will find?



<u>Maths</u>

The children will start the term by continuing our decimals unit. This time we will be looking at different ways to partition a decimal and rounding to the nearest whole numbers. We will then move on to a new unit – Money. Within this topic we will use our knowledge of decimals to convert between pounds and pence, compare amounts of money and calculate with money. We will then move onto our time unit building upon the skills taught in previous years. We will convert between analogue and digital times and using a 24-hour clock. After half term, we will move on to Shape. We will cover angles, triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons and lines of symmetry. Finally, we will be interpreting, comparing and plotting data on line graphs in our statistics unit. Our maths lessons will usually include resources at the children's table to help support them in their learning and challenges available to help children achieve mastery in the different objectives.



<u>English</u>

This term we will start the term writing 1st person narrative. We will be focussing on using descriptive such as adjectives, language expanded noun phrases and some figurative language. After that, we will move on to writing, rehearsing and performing a speech about a topical discussion. The children will focus on using formal language ti convey point of view and practise delivering the message to their audience. After half-term we will be looking at scripts. The children will have the chance to co-write and perform their very own short performances in our school garden. Finally, we will end the year by writing and performing a tetractys poem.

Our SPaG lessons for this final term will include using past verbs, suffixes, prefixes, possessive apostrophes and main/subordinate clauses.

Routines and Reminders

PE days – Happens every Tuesday. Children should come to school in their navy school tracksuit (with or without the school logo), white t-shirt and black trainers.

Library – Y4 will be visiting the school library every Tuesday with their class teacher and every Friday during lunchtime. Please remember to bring in library books on these days if you wish to return it for a new one.

MTC – Later in this term the children will be completing their compulsory multiplication tables check. More information about this will go out in a separate letter.

Reminders – Children should be coming into school with their water bottle and their current reading book. These can be books from home or borrowed from the school library.

Homework

Weekly spellings: These can be found on the school website (under the main heading Curriculum and Assessment and drop down to English) and the children will be tested every Friday.

Daily reading: Children should spend 15-20 minutes of reading a day.

Time Tables Rock Stars: All children have an account to practise their times tables. In Y4 the children will be completing a Times Tables Test towards the end of Y4. They will need to be able to answer questions as quickly as possible. It would be helpful if all Y4 children are practising all the times tables up to X12 in preparation for this test. We are encouraging children to start with increasing their pace when answering x1, x2, x5 and x10 multiplications.

Google Classroom: We will continue to use Google Classroom to upload any work to complete be completed at home. Your child's class teacher will inform them if there is a task to be completed.

Topic: This term, the project is based on our topic 'Pharaohs'. We would like the children to research anything that interests them about Ancient Egypt. Children can choose how they would like to present their research to the class and can be as creative as they choose – posters, PowerPoints, stories, comics, videos etc. From 8th to 19th June children will be invited to present their finished projects to their class if they wish to.

What else will be happening in the Curriculum?

<u>RE</u>

This term we will be learning about Sikhism. We will be focusing on finding out why the Gurdwara is a special place to Sikhs and what the Guru Granth Sahib is. After half term we will start to learn about Buddhism. In this unit we will find out how to live as a Buddhist.

<u>PSHE</u>

As part of our PSHE topic, we will be looking at the unit *'Relationships'* which consists of the children understanding their own relationships with the adults and children in their lives. After half term we will then start our RSE (relationships and sex education) unit. We will let parents know more about these lessons closer to the time.

Art/DT

In Art the children will be looking at Egyptian Art, and will also be inspired by the sculpture of Alberto Giacometti. After half term, the children will be doing a unit called "Alice in Wonderland - Mad Hatter hats" linked to DT, where they will construct their own hats.

<u>Music</u>

In Music the children will be learning about the instruments used in classical Indian music. They will learn about the Alap and Gat sections of classical Indian music by composing their own versions in groups. After half term the children will be learning about Grieg's composition called "In the Hall of the Mountain King" from Peer Gynt.

<u>Spanish</u>

In Spanish this term we will complete a unit called "My Routine". The children will learn how to tell the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. They will also learn how to read timetables, TV schedules and answer simple questions about these. The unit is drawn together with a final lesson which is a mathematics lessons, calculating the difference between two times. After the half term, the children will start a unit called "Free Time". In this unit the children will learn key vocabulary related to holidays, weather, seasons, sports and hobbies. They will revise key opinion phrases to express their preferences. Children will have both writing and speaking opportunities within each lesson.

<u>Science</u>

Our new Science topic is *Living things and their habitats* and we will be learning about how we can group animals using classification keys. We will be using Venn and Carroll diagrams to organise and categorise different living things. We will be using key vocabulary such as herbivore, carnivore, omnivore, vertebrate, invertebrate and species throughout the term. We will end the unit by looking at the local area and discussing how the environment can be impacted on the changes caused by humans.

Computing

We will be looking at Audio Production in our first unit. Children will plan and create their own podcast In our second unit we will working on Repetition in games using Scratch. Their final project is to design and create a game which uses repetition and applying stages of programming design. We will continue to talk about the importance of e-safety throughout.

- Every week your child will be sent home spellings. It is important that you learn these with your child as they will have a spelling test every Friday.
- Reading with your child daily is a great way for them to answer questions and share what they are enjoying about their current reading book.
- Please practise times tables with your child using videos, quizzing, songs, times table Rockstars etc. This will help them to feel prepared for their times table test towards the end of Y4
