Gold Level Award

We are delighted to share with you that we have been awarded Gold Level as a smartphone free school.

Gold standard smartphone free schools have a policy that children are not allowed to bring smartphones on to the school site. Research has shown that this is an “Effective Policy”, which improves behaviour and sees a rise in academic attainment.

The added benefit of a Gold rating is that children are not immediately picking up smartphones on the way home, which reduces the safeguarding risks associated with children showing each other content on smartphones, reduces peer pressure to own one, and according to the MET police, even reduces the risk of mugging.





Christmas Sing-a-Long

To celebrate the festive season, all classes performed a Christmas concert. It included about 4 to 5 songs that were beautifully performed. We handed out programmes which had a song on the back. Some lucky parents had a mince pie on their programme which meant they could have a free drink!

Y3 Trip to the Horniman Museum

On Monday 2nd December, Y3 enjoyed a day out at the Horniman Museum as part of their learning on Prehistoric Britain. The children were able to carefully handle real and replica artefacts, using their observation skills to explore what these objects could tell us about life thousands of years ago. There was a real sense of excitement in the room as they compared textures, shapes and materials, and many were amazed by the size of certain items—especially the enormous mammoth tooth.

After the workshop, the children continued their learning adventure around the museum grounds. The gardens and museum galleries offered even more opportunities for discovery. With quiz sheets in hand, the children worked together to find answers, read signs, and notice details they might otherwise have missed. It was lovely to see their enthusiasm grow as they made connections with what they had been learning.

One of Andrew's colleagues made this amazing reindeer using off-cuts from their workshop.


They thought that Rudolph might bring some extra Christmas cheer to Stillness this festive season and he certainly did!

School Streets

Reminder that Lewisham School Street Programme “School Streets” is in effect. Fines will be issued for those who enter Brockley Rise from the junction with Stillness Road, without an exemption permit from **Monday to Friday** between the set times of **8.30am to 9.30am and 2.45pm to 3.45pm**. Please be aware that local residents are able to access during these hours so we should continue to observe road safety. Thank you.

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Mobile Phones

We are a “mobile free” school.

Please be reminded that mobile phones cannot be brought into school for any reason whatsoever. We strongly believe that children are more at risk when they carry and use a mobile phone than it being a deterrent. Our school policy reflects this and it is a rule that we enforce vigorously.

Any mobile phone brought into school will be taken and can only be collected by a parent/carer; repeat offenders will have their mobile phone held in the school office until the end of term.

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Dinner Money

Following Government Guidelines, primary school children will now receive a school dinner free of charge for the academic year 2024/2025.

Cashless School

To improve the service we provide, we are a cashless school and do not accept cheques or cash as payment.

Payment for school trips etc. can be done online using a very secure website called ParentPay. You all have your individual ID and Password to access this facility.

Please note: if you wish to change your child from packed lunch to school dinners or vice versa please inform the school office in writing together with any allergies they may have.
