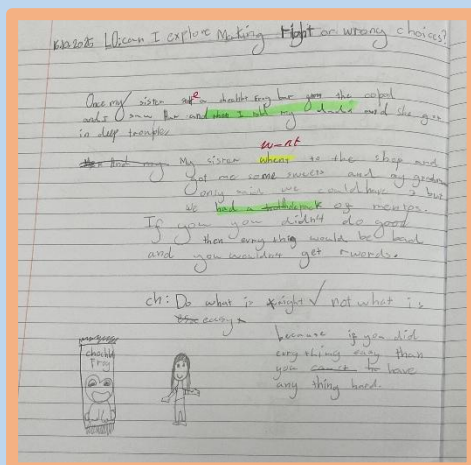
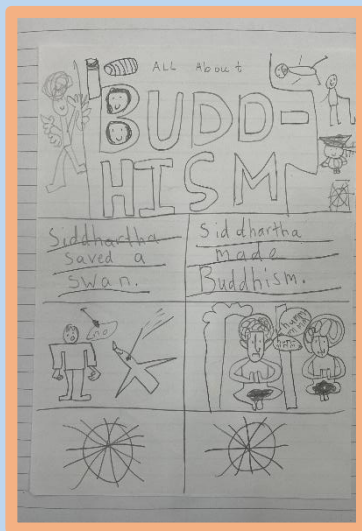

RE whole school overview



Y3

Y3 have been learning about Buddhism and Christianity, focusing on the life of the Buddha and his search for truth. Pupils explored key teachings such as kindness, compassion and empathy, and reflected on ideas of right and wrong. Through stories and discussion, children deepened their understanding of beliefs and values across different religions.



Y4

Y4 visited a synagogue, giving pupils a valuable opportunity to learn about Jewish beliefs, traditions and worship in a real-life setting. Children explored the building, learned about important features such as the Torah, and discovered how faith plays an important role in Jewish community life.

Pupil voice:

- **Alice:** *"We got to see the Torah and it had chains around it. It was great to see it in person!"*
- **Avanti:** *"We got to see a sukkah and it was really fun to see everything inside it!"*

Y5

Y5 visited the Lewisham Islamic Centre, where they were warmly welcomed by the Imam. Pupils learned about Islamic beliefs, prayer and Hajj, and impressed visitors with their respect, kindness and understanding of different faiths.

Pupil voice:

Laurence: *"I loved listening to my classmate read the Qur'an. It was very impressive."*

Benji: *"The Imam was really engaging and I loved hearing about Hajj from him."*



Y6

Y6 loved their visit to a Buddhist temple. They learned about the life of the Buddha, listened to stories about Buddhist teachings and took part in meditation.

Pupil voice:

Maryum: *"It was really calming because it was such a peaceful place. We sat on soft cushions and learned a lot because the person we met told us stories about Buddhism."*

Daood: *"It was a really entertaining experience because we learned about the life of the Buddha when he was human, and we also got to meditate, which was very relaxing."*

Isha: *"It was a really colourful and beautiful building. The visitor was very engaging and the pictures on the walls helped explain the life of the Buddha."*
